THIS GEORGE -

ALTHOUGH THE THIRTEEN STATES LACKED A GREAT POLITICAL LEADER TO CALL FORTH A SPIRIT OF SACRIFICE, WASHINGTONDID HIS BEST TO FULFILL THE POLITICAL AS WELL AS THE MILITARY ROLE. HE WAS MORE THAN A GENERAL: THE EMBODIMENT OF EVERYTHING FINE IN THE AMERICAN CHARACTER. WITH NO ILLUSIONS ABOUT HIS OWN GRANDEUR, NO THOUGHT OF THE FUTURE EXCEPT AN INTENSE LONGING TO RETURN TO MOUNT VERNON, HE ASSUMED EVERY RESPONSIBILITY THRUST UPON HIM, AND FULFILLED IT.HE NOT ONLY HAD TO LEAD AN ARMY, BUT CONSTANTLY WRITE LETTERS TO CONGRESS, STATE LEADERS AND GOVERNMENTS, BEGGING THEM FOR THE WHEREWITHALL TO MAINTAIN HIS ARMY. HE HAD TO COMPOSE QUARRELS AMONG HIS OFFICERS AND PLACATE COLD, HUNGRY UNPAID TROOPS. INTRIGUES AGAINST HIS AUTHORITY HE IGNORED AND THE INTRIGUERS CAME TO GRIEF. In his relations with french OFFICERS, HE PROVED TO BE A DIPLOMAT SECOND ONLY TO FRANKLIN. REFUSING TO ACCEPT A SALARY, HE DIPPED INTO HIS MODEST FORTUNE TO BUY COMFORTS FOR THE SOLDIERS AND TO HELP DESTITUTE FAMILIES OF HIS COMPANIONS IN BATTLE. THUS WASHINGTON BROUGHT SOMETHING MORE IMPORTANT TO THE CAUSE THAN MILITARY ABILITY AND STATESMANSHIP: THE PRICELESS GIFT OF CHARACTER.
