Friends of The Colburn House

An open house and community meeting to consider the organization of a new non - profit group to be known as the Friends of the Colburn House will be held at the Colburn Complex, Arnold Road, off Rt. 27, Pittston, Me. on Sunday Sept. 27th, at 2 P.M.

All Pittston residents are invited, as well as people from neighboring towns, summer residents, and any others interested in this unique 1765 historic site.

Tours of the house and grounds will be conducted before and after the meeting.

Colburn House Restoration News

Mr. George Quintal, of Pittston, has submitted a grant application to the Libra Foundation. This Foundation was established by the well known Maine philanthropist Mrs. Betty Noyes of Augusta.

The State of Maine Parks & Recreation Dept. is still without funds to maintain or restore any of the historic properties in their care. The Colburn House is deteriorating so badly that we seem to be compelled to raise the money privately necessary to save the house for future generations.

Our first goal is \$80,000. This amount would pay to completely rebuild the cellar and foundation walls, and replace rotted sills and support timbers.

We will start an escrow fund shortly, and make an appeal to our members, foundations, and the general public.

Trails
