Annual Meeting

The 26th Annual Meeting of the Society was held at the Dresden Inn on Sunday, Oct. 9th, 1994. Forty-five people attended.

After enjoying a delicious turkey & seafood buffet dinner, we settled back to hear Mrs. Clare Brandt tell of Benedict Arnold's heroic leadership of the small American fleet on Lake Champlain during the naval battle of Valcour Island in the fall of 1776.

She also spoke of her belief that the financial ruin of Arnold's father, which forced Benedict to leave his priviledged situation in private school, and go to work as an apothecary's apprentice, had adversely affected his character.

Her new biography of Arnold " A Man in the Mirror " amplifies this thesis, and is very interesting to read. We recommend it to you.

A Colonial Christmas

The Annual Christmas Open House Party will be held at the Colburn House on Saturday December 10th - from 3:30 - 5 PM.

The festivities will start at the Old Colburn Schoolhouse, down Arnold Road about 500 feet, at 2 PM. A suitably costumed School Marm will conduct a class of children in lessons appropriate to Victorian times. When the class is dismissed, local Sunday School children will present their Christmas Pageant. Finally, Santa Claus will arrive with treats for all the kids.

Everyone is then invited to the Colburn House, where a roaring fire and hot drinks will warm the cockles of our hearts! A male quartet will sing old hymns and Christmas Carols, and a flautist will play as well.

No admission will be charged for either event. The Party is given to acquaint more local residents with the rich historical resources available to them, and as a thank you for community support.

A bake sale will be held all afternoon, Colburn House gold plated Christmas Tree ornaments will be available, and , of course, donations to the Colburn House Restoration Fund will be happily accepted.

Our new President is a life long resident of Pittston with a great appreciation of the 1765 Colburn House, and its place in history. He continues to serve as President of the Pittston Historical Society. This group deserves the credit for saving, and restoring, the 1830 one room Colburn Schoolhouse

Colburn House Restoration Escrow Fund

With the addition of the \$1000 donated by the Town of Pittston, and results of sales and gifts at the Annual Meeting the Fund now totals \$ 10,500. Donors total almost 100.

We are working on reshingling the Colburn House roof. The State will provide the material, and the Society the labor. Bids for the work have been received and all approvals obtained. It will be done either late this year, or early next spring. This will be the first use of the Restoration Escrow Funds.

A Pat on the Back !

We have a great group in our Society Members ! I think it is time to say Thank You ! In little over two years we have raised \$10,500 for the Escrow Fund. Less the disbanded Colburn Militia gift, and the Town of Pittston contribution, this amounts to about \$40 from each of our 200 members. This is very generous, and you all deserve praise and recognition!

You have supported the Society by buying tapes, books, and Christmas Ornament, plus giving unstinted time and effort to Society activities. George Quintal, the Warren families, Senior & Junior, Gene Lockyer, Karen Milliman and Martha Milliman Takatsu all helped out on Sunday Oct. 16th washing storm windows and winterizing the

Colburn House.

Crosby & Karen Milliman contributed an aluminum canoe, complete with paddles and life jackets to the Nichols Cabin, earlier this year. Their grandchildren keep the Colburn House lawn cut.

Cecil Pierce has again this year made a most generous gift to the Society, to be used as prize for a raffle. One of his hand carved, solid mahogany, round piecrust top Queen Anne tables, an exact replica of a 1760 antique passed down in his family.

The top is 26" in diameter and is hinged so it can be tilted to a vertical position, if desired. The table stands 28 1/2 " high.

Valued at \$1500 we will sell raffle tickets until we reach this goal - then draw for a winner.

COLBURN HOUSE CHRISTMAS TREE ORNAMENT


